This release include three significant changes to Aacapella Read functionality.

Navigation

The Navigation buttons have been relocated and their functionality has been changed to make navigation easier.

Swapping between students

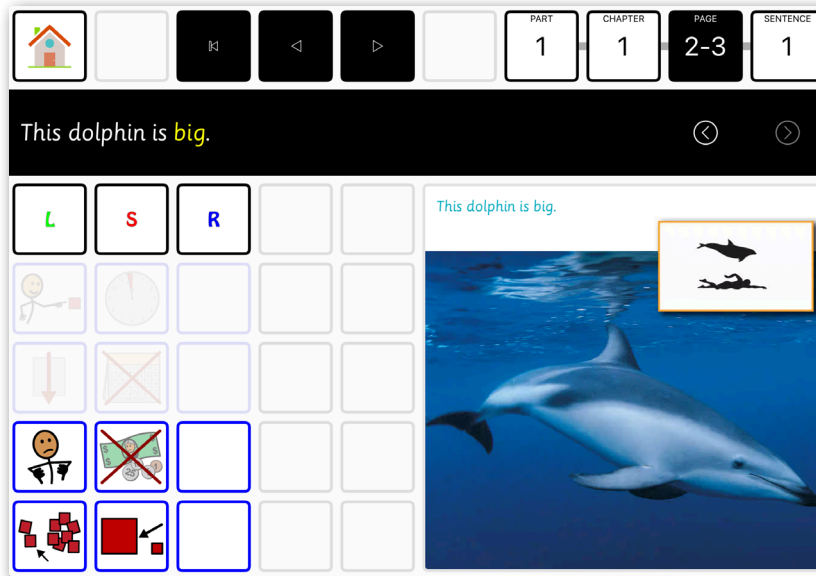
A new button facilitates quick changes between student and teacher profiles.

Reduced delay between words

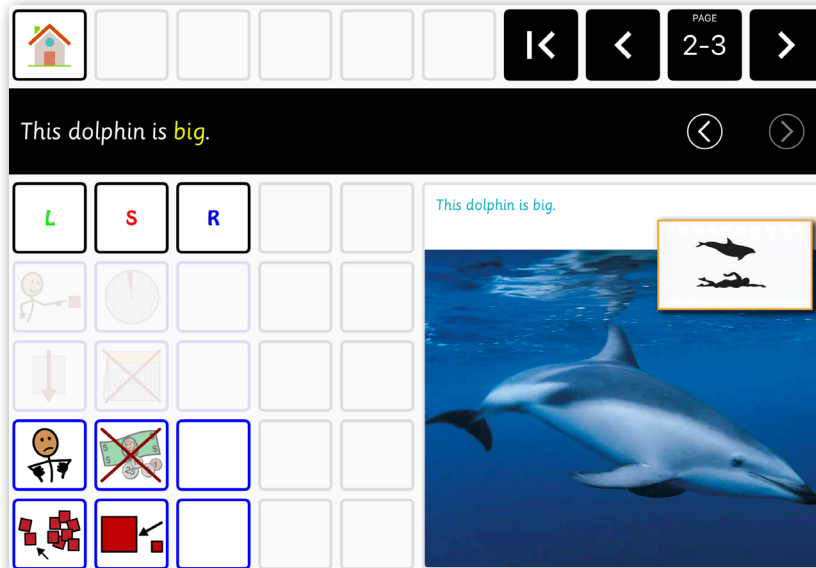
After a word has been read, there is a slight delay before the next word can be read. In this version the delay is reduced to facilitate fluency.

The Navigation buttons have been relocated and their functionality has been changed to make navigation easier.

The arrows move you between pages. The Restart button on the left takes you back to the Title Page of the book.

Between the forward and back buttons is the Page button which displays the current page number.

In pages with more than one sentence, double tapping the Page button changes navigation from pages to sentences. The arrows now move you between the sentences on the page. Double tapping again returns you to page navigation.

Reminder: the arrows in the sentence bar move you between words.

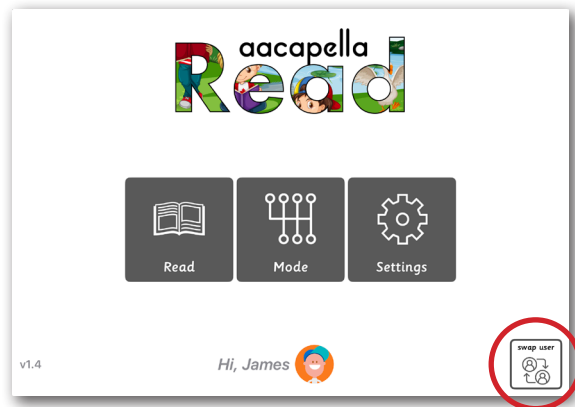

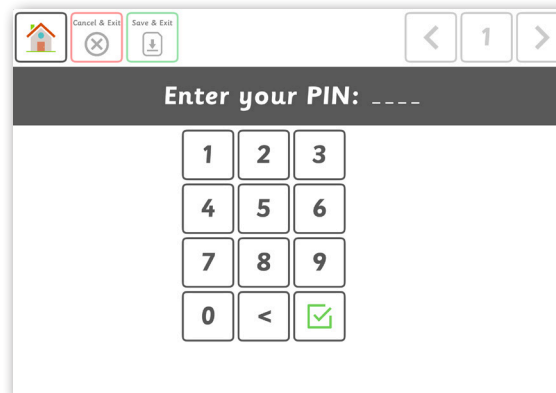
Switch users in 3 easy steps

A new button facilitates quick changes between student and teacher profiles.

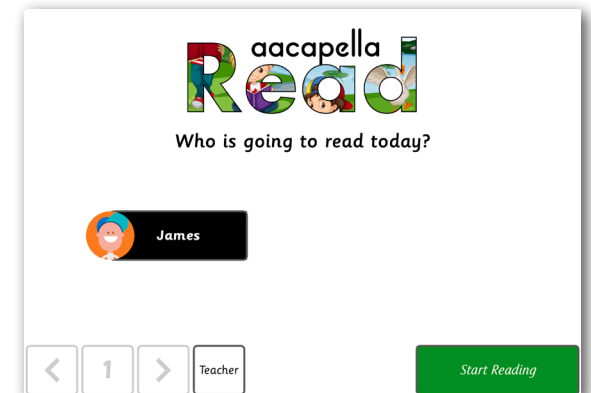
- 1 Tap the **swap users** button on the Home screen



- 2 Enter your PIN and tap the green tick button



- 3 Tap the name of the student or the Teacher button and tap the green **Start Reading** button



Reduced delay between words

After a word has been read, there is a slight delay before the next word can be read. In this version the delay is reduced to facilitate fluency.

This change is in response to requests from teachers with more advanced students who want to read with fluency. Their students were frustrated that they had to wait for the next word to become active.
